

Open Letter to All the Knights...

November 26, 2012

Dear Brother Knights of Columbus Council 5300,

I am writing to you because Knights of Columbus Council 5300 needs your help. I believe that the Council is in trouble and it needs you to help pull itself together and put the Council back on a more positive course.

What's wrong you say? Well, to start with participation in the Council Business meetings is dismal. We have not had a quorum in two of the last five Council Business meetings. This means that no official business can be conducted and important items like Council philanthropy cannot be acted upon.

Slim attendance at Business meetings means that fewer people are available to discuss plans and activities and to provide their opinions on the direction that the Council should pursue. Also, fewer Knights are aware of what is going on in the Council and fewer "bodies" are available to volunteer, signup, and make possible the many things that the Knights try to do as charitable works for our community.

Another issue is that Council membership is shrinking. We have lost 62 members since 2009; some to death (17), a few to transfers, but mostly to suspensions for non-payment of dues. And we have recruited only 10 new members in the same time frame. Tragically very few of the new members are actively involved or attend meetings. Brother Sam Alfano, before he passed to join the Lord, was a one man recruiting team, but building the team and recruiting new members is every Knight's responsibility.

Some of you belong to the 4th Degree Assembly and perhaps attend those meetings. Because of the Color Corps colorful uniforms, the 4th Degree is the most visible and public part of the Knights. But the 4th Degree would not exist without the 3rd Degree and participating in 4th Degree should not be the end of participation in 3rd Degree activities. Unfortunately, some Knights "retire" to 4th Degree and the Council loses their manpower, even if the only action that they perform in 3rd Degree is to help make a quorum.

I know that I maybe speaking to the choir and you are one of the "usual suspects" who does actively participate in 3rd Degree. So you ask, "Waddaya wan me to do?" Well, how about these:

- 1. Come to 3rd Degree meetings. If you cannot make a meeting, call a Brother Knight and ask him to substitute for you.
- 2. Talk amongst yourselves and other Knights about the issues that I have raised here and other issues that the Council is facing (membership, fund raising, philanthropy choices, unfilled committee positions, etc.).
- 3. "Arm twist" some fellow Knights to "come back to the fold" and actively participate in the Council. Tell them up front, "The Council needs you."
- 4. Be pro-active and help prevent Council 5300 from withering away due to lack of interest.

Just a disclamer. These are my opinions and not the position of Council 5300. Perhaps you have a solution or an opinion. Please call me, e-mail me, meet me for a cup of coffee or just come to a meeting.

Patrick John Konkol Earns Eagle Scout Rank

By Installing 50 Trail Signs near Figueroa Mtn.

Patrick John Konkol is the most recent Boy Scout member of Troop 105 to complete the requirements for the Eagle Rank, when he successfully passed his Eagle Board of Review on November 15.

The 16-year old Dos Pueblos sophomore took on a difficult community project to complete his requirements, organizing and installing 50 trail signs in the area near Figueroa Mountain. The previously unmarked network of trails is used by hikers, bikers and horse riders.

The Eagle Board members commented that Patrick set a high bar for aspiring Eagles. His project showed incredible organization, and the hours he and his team put in, and the effort put forth were well above the norm.

Scoutmaster Glenn Schiferl commented, "Patrick has matured through the Scouting program and even commented on how much he learned completing his project. He has led the Troop as Senior Patrol Leader and is active in the Order of the Arrow. He continues to help other Scouts, providing leadership and guidance back to the Troop members."

Schiferl added, "Troop 105 Eagle Scouts in 2011 and 2012 include: Patrick Schlesselmann, Thomas Schiferl, Andrew Leicht, Jeremy Zaida and Fritz Mora.

Born on October 21, 1996 at Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital, Patrick's parents, Richard Smith and Ann Marie Konkol-Smith are proud of Patrick's many Scout achievements since joining Troop 105 in 2007 while a student at St. Raphael's. His parents were married on Nov. 10, 2001 by Rev. Msgr. Stephen Noel Downes in St. Raphael Church. Richard works at Ablitts Dry Cleaners and Ann Marie is employed at Mentor Worldwide LLC, a Division of J&J. They also have a son, Konrad Clark Smith, age 5.

Two important reasons why Patrick decided to become a Boy Scout were family heritage and other classmates joined Scouting. Patrick proudly stated, "My grandfather William John Konkol was a Cub Master in Wisconsin and grandmother Kathleen Marie was a Den Mother. In California he was Webelos Leader for St. Raphael Cub Pack 105, District Pinewood Derby for six years, Troop 105 Committee and Trek Leader. Also both of my uncles, Bill Jr., and Tim are Eagle Scouts from Troop 105. There are four Eagle Scouts in my immediate family and I am now the 5th Eagle Scout."

Patrick's recommendations why other boys and girls should consider becoming Scouts: "Good morals, learn skills, learn leadership skills and fun activities."

When asked to explain in detail his Eagle Scout Project, Patrick responded descriptively from start to finish. He said, "My Eagle Service Project was suggested to me by Mr. Richard Scholl who is the Assistant Scout Master of Troop 105. I started in mid-July after I did an initial survey of the project site at the Midland High School. The project covered an area of about 2 x 2 square miles of hiking and equestrian trails on the school's property. My project was to make and install 50 trail signs on these unmarked hiking and equestrian trails. I worked under the guidance of the Santa Barbara Trail Council (SBTC) Rep. Mr. Ford who recently had a big trail article in the Santa Barbara News-Press."

Patrick continued, "My project had nine phases: project planning, obtaining \$1,350 in pledges for the funding, procurement of materials, processing of signs, processing of routered letters on signs, project site installation of the posts and signs and return unused portions of funding." The overall project cost came to \$950.

Patrick scheduled several work dates, September 1 was a main work date. Four different work stations were set up to process the signs and posts in preparation to complete the installation on September 15. He then recruited enough scouts and adult leaders as Scouting has a strict policy of YPT trained leaders. He assigned six trail routes that required six groups of scouts and fathers. Each route had a somewhat different degree of difficulty to hikers and installers of the posts and signs. The 4"x 4"x 6 foot posts and 2"x 6"x 2 foot trail signs along each trail had to be carried by the scouts and installed. Most trails turned out to be in the 1.65 mile range while some were in the 2.2 mile range. Adult leaders installed posts and signs in the rugged jeep trail areas and other scout fathers and friends installed posts and signs along the road on Figueroa Mountain Road. Patrick acclaimed, "It was amazing that all 50 trail posts and signs were installed in about four or so hours. The temperature was in the very high 90's to 100 degrees by the time we were finished."

From start to finish there was a combined work effort by all who helped of 789.8 hours and 1,895 miles were driven. On the project installation day there were 277 work hours by 16 scouts and 16 scout leaders, family and friends and five helpers from the SBTC under the direction of Mr. Ford. There was a combination of 13 trucks, cars, vans and one motorcycle that drove a combined total of 1,156 miles on the project day. It is about 40 miles one way to the project site from St. Raphael's parking lot.

Patrick acknowledged, "I learned a lot in the completion of my Eagle Scout project. I am very thankful to all who funded and discounted materials, and to all of the Scouts, adults, parents, friends and neighbors who helped with my project. There were 48 total helpers at one point or another who helped with my Eagle Scout project."

To be an Eagle Scout one must earn 21 merit badges of which 12 badges are required. Some of these badges have a required time span of several months to earn the merit badge. Patrick has earned the following badges for his rank of Eagle Scout: Camping, Citizenship in the community, Citizenship in the nation, Citizenship in the world, Communications, Emergency Preparedness, Environmental Science, First Aid, Swimming, Personal Management, Personal Fitness, Family Life, Shotgun shooting, Small boat sailing, Bugling, Golf, Music, Indian lore, Rifle shooting, Wood carving, Pioneering.

Patrick recognized Glenn Schiferl, Troop 105 Scout Master, and Timothy Hogan, Committee Chairman of Troop 105, for their super help to him on his project.

Other important participation by Patrick at St. Raphael involves being a second year candidate in the Monday night sessions in the Confirmation program and being one of the weekly Ushers at the 5:30 Youth Mass on Sundays. He stated, "I am looking forward to my Confirmation on April 6, 2013."

His favorite travel destinations as a Scout included Camp Chawaanakee, troops activities at Shaver Lake and the week long leadership training program called White Stag in northern California.

Patrick's other hobbies of special interests are playing the trumpet in the DP Advanced Jazz Band, being the Bugler for Troop 105 and wrestling in the DP program.

In recollecting the best thing about being a Scout, Patrick stated, "Setting goals and achieving goals and learning various skills and having fun." His next step is to continue to help, lead his troop and work on additional badges to earn Eagle Palms."






