

#### The Future of the Building Fund

At the last business meeting a committee (Brother Knights John Peyton, Chris Arnoult, Jim Bradbury, Richard Scholl, Ed Barrier, Joe Darga) review was presented on the future of the building fund.

#### Background:

1. The Building fund is at a substantial level and is a valuable asset that sits idle. 2.) With an aging membership and trouble getting younger new members, the need for a building to serve as the Council's home is questionable. 3.) The philanthropy budget is in jeopardy of not being met due to income shortfalls also as a result of membership issues.

#### **Investigation**:

A Review of The By-Laws allows for taking income from the building fund for specific purposes. Also, By-laws can be changed at any time if needed.

After some discussions this committee felt a new building was not something the Council needed. It was determined after reviewing multiple options for this fund and consistent with our mission that the best use at present time would be to use it as a form of endowment for scholarships. The goal would be to have some portion of the annual income be used, while the principle and some percentage of the income would remain in the fund so it grows.

The initial thoughts center around some type of scholarships for Bishop Diego and/or St. Raphael school. There are many ways this could be done but right now the decision is whether funding scholarships with the Building Fund income is what

we want to do.



At the Business meeting there were no objections to moving forward. The next phase would involve 1.) how to set up the fund for cash spin off,

2.) deciding on the optimum way to set up the scholarship(s), 3.) determining restrictions that would accompany the scholarships.

Any input can be submitted at the March Business meeting or to any of the above committee members.

The Lenten Fish Frys began Feb. 15 and will continue the following five weeks. This will surely be a taste treat and low-cost as well. The price will be \$10 for the complete meal. The no-host bar will be open. Last year we netted over \$9,000 and it was our biggest fund raising event. We need everyone to come out and make the Fish Frys an even bigger success since our funds are a bit low to meet our charity budget. Treat a friend or neighbor to an evening of good food and fraternity.

The crew is primed and ready, but we could use a few extra hands on cleanup. Also needed are people to train in as some of the long time volunteers are looking toward retirement. It's a joy to be a part of the effort.

## Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Charity by Richard Scholl

This is the twentieth in a series of Knightline articles about the religious orders which have served in the Santa Barbara area. They give us an example of what can be accomplished by trusting in God's providence.

The Sisters of St. Francis of Penance and Christian Charity was founded in the Netherlands by Mother Magdalen (Catherine) Damen. While working as a domestic, Catherine became acquainted with Franciscan spirituality, and made her perpetual profession in the Franciscan Third Order Secular in 1817. She and her tertiary companions taught religion, needlework, and visited the sick. This was preparation for later work with the neglected children of Heythuysen, the small Dutch village that became the birthplace of the congregation. Three women

attracted by Catherine's simplicity and dedication joined her in 1827 and became the nucleus of the religious congregation which she founded in 1835. Like many religious orders, a small beginning led to a much greater presence, now almost 3,000 sisters working on 5 continents in 10 provinces and 3 missions with central administration in Rome, Italy. They currently are in Germany, Italy, Poland, Indonesia, Brasil, Tanzania, Mexico, Micronesia, and the USA.

The presence of the congregation in the United States dates from 1874, when the first three missionary Sisters, accompanied by General Superior Mother Aloysia Lenders, arrived in Buffalo, New York. The difficulties of life for many religious congregations in Bismarck's Germany had coincided with a request for sisters by the German Jesuits working among the German immigrants in the city. Mother Aloysia answered the request from America and nine sisters soon arrived. This may happened in one of God's mysterious ways. Many of the sisters in Germany were not keen on following Sr. Aloysia to the USA. The diocese, in order to save a little money, shortened Sr. Aloysia's telegram from "SEND SISTERS, BISHOP WILLING, SR ALOYSIA" to "SEND SISTERS, BISHOP WILLING". This was interpreted in Germany as an order from a Bishop named "Willing" which the sisters felt they must obey. Here the Sisters established their first American motherhouse and novitiate. The novitiate remained in Buffalo until 1908, when the move was made to Stella Niagara in the Town of Lewiston. Stella Niagara is now an education park and renewal center. Respect for the land and attention to its beauty expresses the tradition of St. Francis of Assisi.

In early years, the Sisters planted vineyards, orchards, and gardens, and raised animals. In recent years, they formed a group, "Stella as Earth Center," which focuses attention on the beautification of the property and supports projects to provide for the many varieties of wildlife which share the land with the Sisters. Today, the Health Center of the Sisters is there, together with many elderly Sisters and those involved in ministry.
