

Mother's Day is Sunday, May 12th and all mothers




will receive a complimentary breakfast between 8:30 and 11 a.m. in the Parish Hall. Our Council will also distribute orchids to our mothers after each Mass.



In the late 1920's Mario and his older brother Charles started collecting food scraps to help feed the hogs that their mom was raising. Over the years this hauling business has evolved into what is now known as MarBorg Industries. In 1938 Mario met Marguerite Saulsburg, the love of his life. They were married in November of 1941 at St. Joan of Arc Church in Las Vegas. Mario and Marguerite (Peggy) were married for 70-years and had two sons, David and Mario Jr. Peggy died June 1, 2011. Franciscan Sisters of Penance and Charity

There are 3 United States Provinces headquartered in Denver, Colorado (Sacred Heart Province), Redwood City, California (St. Francis Province), and Stella Niagara, NY (Holy Name Province). The United States provinces sponsor missions in Chiapas, Mexico and Tanzania, East Africa. Moving to the West Coast came about through the invitation of Franciscan priests who were working Germany, with immigrants from first in Sacramento, then in Los Angeles working in schools and parishes with immigrants from Germany, Japan, Mexico, and Southern Europe. Invitations then came from around the west for ministry in health care and teaching. For the first several decades, teaching, child care and health care were the greatest needs of the Catholic immigrant communities. In 1940, the Sisters established a hospital in Santa Maria, which has continually expanded to become the Marian Regional Medical Center.

In the nineteen sixties and seventies with the renewed vision of church expressed in the Second Vatican Council, and the struggles in the US for human and economic rights, the work of the sisters also broadened out, answering to the human needs of a new time in pastoral work, faith formation, peace and solidarity projects, health care, spiritual direction and retreat, education, literacy, elder care, job development, and recovery programs. As their ministries diversified, their living situations also became diverse, living in smaller communities, drawing them closer to the people they serve.

Locally, Sr. Susan Blomstadt heads the Franciscan Renewal Center at the Old Mission. The St. Francis Province has established itself on a firmer financial footing than many struggling religious orders in a unique way: one of the sisters hit it big in the California lottery and gave her winnings to the province.

Another development that has had great influence in St. Francis Province is their Associate program.

April 2013, Knightline 5300, Page 10 These sisters and brothers are not called to the vowed life, but feel deeply the call of the Franciscan spirit of Mother Magdalen and her Sisters. They share mission, vision, prayer life and assemblies.

The sisters' work in Mexico as part of an interprovincial mission in Chiapas shows how they leverage their resources. Starting with a base in Palenque, established at the invitation of Bishop Samuel Ruiz, they began with a house of hospitality, started a clinic, and then a vocation discernment house. From this base, the sisters work in the many small centers of their far-flung parish, ministering to the indigenous and mestizo communities and educating them to take over.

The order's mission statement reads: We are women choosing to live the gospel of Jesus Christ as Sisters of St. Francis in the spirit of our foundress, Magdalen Damen. Our diversity of gifts is a power we choose to use for and with others because we are sisters to all. Conscious of our personal, communal, and national experience of history, sin, and grace,

Wherever we live and serve, we contemplate the Word of God and call one another to conversion of heart in order to transform unjust structures and to hear the cry of the poor. Trusting in God and open to risk, courage.
