Francis 'Frank' Joseph Donohoe Jr. was born on May 18, 1937 in Wilmington, Delaware. Frank and Cay (Cyback) were married on Sept. 7, 1963, 50 years ago this summer, at the Old Mission Santa Barbara by Father Emmanuel Meusseingang, the Pastor. This year is their 50th Wedding Anniversary.



### **Of Lenten Fish Fry Meals**

On request from several fish fry "afishionados", here is some history of lenten fish consumption and information on the fish we serve. Evidently, Lenten fish frys are a part of the sweep of history.

What gave Christopher Columbus, our model, the confidence in 1492 to set out across the Atlantic Ocean? It would be convenient to believe that Columbus and his men were uniquely courageous. A more reasonable explanation, however, is that Columbus was heir to a body of knowledge about seas and ships acquired at great cost over many centuries. Anthropologist Brian Fagan's book, *Fish on Friday*, tells a new story of the discovery of America.

In his view, the Church's tradition of not eating meats on Fridays and in holy times created a vast market for fish that could not be fully satisfied by emerging methods of fish farming, better fishing equipment, or new preservation techniques such as smoking and salting. Then, when the onset of the Little Ice Age diminished fish stocks off Norway and Iceland, fishermen were forced to range ever farther to the south and west, eventually discovering incredibly rich shoals within sight of the Maine coast. Columbus probably heard about this rich land to the west. The rest is history.

The scientific name of the fish we buy from Santa Cruz Market is Pangasius hypophthalmus. market name for this fish is swai. Pangasius is a genus of imported freshwater fish that has become the tenth most popular seafood product eaten in the United States. Pangasius species are primarily found in Vietnam, Cambodia and neighboring nations. The demand for these fish is driving an expansion of farming operations in other nations including China, Cambodia, Laos and Thailand and helping to bring these nations into a stable world economy. Wild harvest is possible but very limited, and the wild fish are subject to considerable variation in quality. Various organizations, regional and national authorities, and third parties have focused on measures to assure sustainability. Producers, buyers, international organizations, and national authorities are advancing and mandating the use of Best Aquaculture Practices (BAP'S) to minimize impacts on local environments and Pangasius species have a low to communities. moderate fat content with high levels of protein. Market attempts to distinguish product sources have resulted in publicity claims about food safety issues related to pollution or the use of antibiotics in these products. While some of these concerns may have been partially true in prior and limited situations, both growers and governments have responded to these claims by imposing additional food safety controls and specific product monitoring procedures.
