VIVAT JESUS

Recommended reading: A Civilization of Love: What Every Catholic Can Do to Transform the World by Supreme Knight Carl Anderson. Here is a sampling:

There is an increasing bicultural rift that has been continuing national debate over immigration. But I would like to suggest that the more fundamental rift is different from what Huntington describe. It is not a division between Anglo and Hispanic, English and Spanish, North and South, Protestant and Catholic. While these cleavages can not be ignored, they are far less central than another divide that cuts across all these categories and splits society much more deeply, in part because it splits individuals more deeply. It is the division between what Pope John Paul II has called Culture of Life and Culture of Death.

Another interesting passage:

What Muslims often reject in this Western mindset is not a different religion but the apparent absence of religious values. Samuel Huntington writes, "In Muslim eyes Western secularity, irreligiosity, and hence immorality are worse evils are worse evils than Western Christianity...In the Cold War the West labeled its opponents *Godless communism;* in the post-Cold War conflict of civilization Muslims see their opponents as the *Godless West.*"


Rev. Frank Colborn's Golden Anniversary

Rev. Frank Colborn, retired priest who has been helping to celebrate Masses at St. Raphael Church since July 2007, was among this year's golden jubilarian priests to be honored during the March 25 Chrism Mass at Our Lady Queen of Angels Cathedral with Archbishop Jose Gomez presiding.

Father Colborn was born in Berkeley on July 1, 1938 and is the only member of St. John's class ordained in Rome (Dec. 18, 1963). He served as Associate Pastor at St. Ignatius, L.A., (1964), St. Philip the Apostle, Pasadena (1965-67), Graduate House of Studies, Rome (1967-69), St. Alphonsus, East L.A. (1974-85, and as Pastor for six years at Holy Name of Jesus, LA. (1993-99), and eight years at St. Andrew, Pasadena (1999-2007).

In 1969 Father Colburn received his STD degree in Rome from the Gregorian University and taught moral theology at St. John's for 10 years. For several years, 1986-93, he held the post of Chaplain at the Newman Center for the Claremont colleges. Formerly Vicar Forane (Dean) for Deanery 10, he retired in 2007 and lives in Santa Barbara.

Father knew at an early age that he wanted to pursue a vocation to religious life and the priesthood. He professed his first vows in 1952 and was ordained in Rome by the Auxiliary Bishop of Rome. His first Mass was celebrated at the Chapel



of Catacombs of Priscilla in Rome on Dec.19, 1963.


Parishioners since 1997, Bill serves as Usher at the 5:30 p.m.

On Saturday 17 August at Saint Marks Church in IV, Kathleen Domingo of the Archdiocese of LA Office of Life, Justice and Peace visited with prolife leaders in the local community from Oxnard to Santa Maria. Among the items discussed was a prolife poster program that is being initiated in some schools. It is a set of nine posters depicting the development of the child inside the mother's womb during each month of the child's development. The students can monitor and follow the child's progress. Such a program is being planned for Saint Raphael's school with the enthusiastic support of the school principal. This poster program will be shown at the next Council meeting on 9 September.

The next pro-life vigil at Planned Parenthood on Garden Street in Santa Barbara will be on Sunday 8 September at 3 PM. It lasts about 40-minutes. Please consider joining with your fellow Knights and others in supporting this endeavor. Drop by and see how this peaceful, prayerful and non-confrontational celebration of life unfolds.



"Teacher, where do you stay?"

After the baptism of Jesus, the disciples of John the Baptist see Jesus walking down the road and begin to follow Him. Jesus notices them, so He turns and asks, "What are you looking for?" They reply "Teacher, where do you stay?" Jesus then invites them to "Come and see." So they went to see where he lodged and stayed with Jesus. John 1:31-39

The most effective way to evangelize is to show the contagious joy of knowing Jesus Christ in our daily life. The saying, "actions speak louder than words" is very true in living the life of a Catholic. How do we conduct ourselves in work, during times of play, in suffering trials and in those times we think no one is watching? We, too, invite others to "come and see" where we live on a daily basis by witnessing with our very lives.

The native of Fairfield, Ohio, has held also these other important Council 5300 positions: Essay Contest Chairperson, Lecturer, Chancellor, Advocate, Deputy Grand Knight and Financial Secretary from 2009-13.

One of several things Chris would like to see Council 5300 do is become more involved with new members and membership growth. Arnoult stated, "Unfortunately the Council median age has been getting older and as us 'ole timers' get up there in age we don't have the stamina to do all the work that we used to do."
