They are proud parents of daughter Sylvia. Joe has a brother Norbert and a sister Ursula.



**Resolution--**Preliminary K of C 5300 Scholarship Grant Fund Memorandum of Understanding 7/12/2013 Mark-up of Meeting of the Building Fund Committee held 7/9/13

I. The current Building Fund would be set up to fund scholarships.

- II. Funding:
  - a. The Building Fund, hereafter called the Knights of Columbus 5300 Scholarship Fund, would remain with Edward Jones.
  - b. The earnings of the fund (both capital appreciation as well as interest/dividend earnings for the calendar year) would be cashed out at \$30,000 per year. The distribution would be made by January 31<sup>st</sup> to K of C 5300. The balance of the fund will be no less than \$400k after the distribution.
  - c. Council 5300 will send the entire check to Bishop Diego High School by March 1st.



Expanding Abortion in California - AB 154 (Atkins, D- San Diego) and AB 980 (Pan, D-Sacramento), sponsored by Planned Parenthood, propose to dramatically expand abortion access in the state. The bills would allow mid-level clinicians, who have had an eight-week training course, to perform first trimester abortions. # Only Having "Through Work" Insurance Can be a Bit Scary.


# Happy 78<sup>th</sup> Birthday on Oct. 19<sup>th</sup> **Geri Ann Kovach**





- I. Distribution of Funds
