
Grand Knight's Report





Longtime Santa Barbara resident and leader James A. Wasil died on Wednesday, Jan. 29, 2014, after battling an annoying and elusive illness to a standstill.

With 27 years teaching at Santa Barbara HighSchool, 42-years in the Army Reserves, 62 years a father, the life of a terrific man and Patriot comes to an end.

A 39 year resident of Goleta and a veteran with 38 years of active duty, Mr. Wasil taught political science and social studies at SBHS.

A longtime political activist, he ran for City Council in Goleta in 2001. He also served on the Ohio State Democratic Committee.

He is survived by his brothers Alex and Ray, sister Anna, sons Douglas and Daniel, daughter Melanie and grandchildren Aaron, Kelsie, Amanda, Harrison and Madeleine.



Charity, Philanthropy and Council 5300

Brothers, I thought it would be informative if I wrote about the philanthropy that Council 5300 performs as part of the duty of Knights to be charitable.

You probably remember that the first principle of our order is Charity. Our Council manifests this principle, Charity, in numerous ways. Individual Brothers volunteer their services, labor and time to help at Church as Eucharistic ministers, ushers, Eucharist delivery to homebound etc., or volunteer in the community as a docent at a public facility, helping in the schools, participating in pro-life activities, etc. As a Council we manifest Charity by donating, as a Council, labor for events such as the Tri-tip Sandwich Booth at St. Raphael Parish Picnic, the St. Marks Youth Tri-tip dinner, sponsoring the Religious Appreciation Dinner, etc. Probably the most significant way that Council 5300 manifests Charity is by making philanthropic money donations to various organizations and individuals that have requested assistance or where Council members recognized a need recommended that Council 5300 provide assistance.

Money for Council 5300 philanthropy comes from income generating events that the Council stages and is based on volunteer labor from Knights and community members. Some of these income generating events that you may have participated in include: Lent Friday Fish Dinners, monthly Sunday breakfasts, the Old Spanish Days Coke Booth at de la Guerra Plaza, a golf tournaments and special dinners such as St. Patrick's Day Dinner, Columbus Day Dinner and Oktoberfest Dinner.

Over the last five years, Council 5300 has made philanthropic donations of more \$80,000.00 or on average more than \$16,000.00 per year. Examples of the recipients of Council 5300's philanthropy are youth group organizations, Christian outreach on campus, pro-life organizations, assistance to organizations supporting the poor, seminarians, priests, St. Raphael School, St. Raphael Church, St. Mark's Church, Boy Scout and Cub Scout Troops, missionary organizations and many others.

Starting this Columbian Year, 2013-2014, Council 5300 may be starting on a new charity actions that by itself will be more than double the value of our past yearly philanthropy monies. Details are still be worked on. Fortunately, Council members will not have to cook more dinners or work more hours to fund any new charity actions, but we still need to keep our "regular, old philanthropy" well-funded and working. So, we will still be having income generating events like Lent Friday Fish Dinners, Coke Booth, monthly Sunday breakfasts, and special, fun dinners. So please, the Council will continue to need your volunteer help and participation so we can do our philanthropy ... for our principle of Charity.
