Grand Knight's Report

From William Fuhrer, Our Grand Knight

My mom was so disappointed in the first mass at St. Joseph Church in Pittsburgh not in Latin. Her response was "if I wanted to go to a Protestant mass I would go to one". I thought a purge of the Latin mass was in the Vatican II documents and kind of wondered why potential priest and nuns were leaving from vocations. Even though I flunked Latin I in public school I knew it was a special language since it was the root of all the romance languages.

I never really was curious enough to find Second Vatican II documents. The Second Vatican Council put forward the following principles regarding a liturgical reform:

1. During the liturgical celebration, the human, the temporal and action must be directed towards the divine, the eternal, and contemplation; the role of the former must be subordinated to the latter.



2. During the liturgical

celebration, the realization that the earthly liturgy participates in the heavenly liturgy will have to be encouraged

- 3. There must be absolutely no innovation, therefore no new creation of liturgical rites, especially in the rite of the Mass, unless it is for a true and certain gain for the Church, and provided that all is done prudently and, if it is warranted, that new forms replace the existing ones organically.
- 4. The rite of the Mass must be such that the sacred is more explicitly addressed.

- 5. Latin must be preserved in the liturgy, especially in Holy Mass
- 6. Gregorian chant has pride of place in the liturgy.

If there is no weighty reason for saying the Mass in English, what reasons are there for using the Latin language?

The Latin language is well adapted for service of the Church because:

It is a Venerable Language

It is venerable on account of its origin and its antiquity. It is the language in which praises of God resounded from the lips of Christians during the first centuries.

It is a Mysterious Language

Because it is a dead language, not understood by the people, there is an element of mystery about the Latin tongue. The use of an unknown tongue conveys in the mind of the people that something is going on upon the altar which is beyond their comprehension. That a mystery is being enacted. The Jews in their worship made use of the ancient Hebrew, the language of the Patriarchs. Both the Greek Catholics and the Greek schismatics employ the old form of the Greek language for divine service.

It Fosters Unity in the Church

The use of Latin is a means of maintaining unity in the Church, as well as uniformity in her services, for the use of one and the same language in Catholic churches all over the surface of the globe is a connecting link-binding them to Rome and making one out of nations which are separated by a diversity of tongues. The Universal Church must have a universal language.

It Safeguards Truth

A dead language is not subject to change. Languages in daily use undergo a continual process of change. The meaning of the words in a dead language is fixed. If a living language were employed in divine worship, heresies and errors would evevitably creep into the Church. And sacred words would be employed in an irreverent or mocking manner by the unbeliever.



Father Richard Kayizzi resided at St. Raphael for one year while he was studying for his ordination at St. John's Seminary. He is now at Bostom College getting a Masters Degree in Pastoral Care and Counseling and will finish on May 19. His last assignment was Chaplain at a boys boarding school in Uganda, his homeland, with 1,200 boys and girls school with 700 girls. Kids love him!

When he returns to Uganda, his Bishop has proposed that he train all the CCD teachers in his diocese of Kampala. This means he will have to go to over 500 schools! Each of the 56 parishes have about 10 outlying missions and all of them have schools, but Father Richard has no car. The Bishop does not have the means to provide one. Can you help?
