Who are the Knights of Columbus and what do they do?

We are a Christian organization made up of a group of men that have a great love for God and His Son, Jesus. We share some of this love through the charitable contributions that we undertake throughout the year. Some of the organizations that we, as Knights, contribute to are local and some are world wide. Last year alone we donated over \$48,000 to different organizations.

Most of that stayed right here in our own church community. To raise these funds, the Knights put in many hours of volunteering. For example, the monthly breakfasts, the coke booth at Fiesta, and many dinners.

September will be a very busy month for the Knights. We have the breakfast on the second Sunday of the month. We will have a Labor Day picnic at Tuckers Grove. We will need help with manning four booths at the Parish picnic on September 28, 2014. The Knights will be in charge of a tri-tip sandwich booth, a beer and wine booth, a nacho and cheese booth, as well as a Christmas card booth.

As I stated in last month's article it would be great to have some newer Knights volunteer to help man these booths and come to the church picnic. You will find it both rewarding and a lot of fun to help out.

This year, according to our Supreme Knight Carl Anderson, the Knights of Columbus set an all time record for charitable donations and service hours in 2013 by helping in communities worldwide and have responded to a number of large scale humanitarian crisis. The Knights have donated over \$170 million dollars and more than 70.5 million volunteer hours. That to me is absolutely unbelievable and I am proud that I am a member of such a wonderful, giving Christian organization.

On July 19th we had the pre-Fiesta party. I feel that a great time was had by all. We had about 80 people attend with the theme of old Spanish Days. We were entertained by the runner up to the Spirit of Fiesta dancing and a trio of beautiful dancers dancing for us. The food was prepared in the traditional Mexican way with all the true Mexican Spanish flavors shining through.

Pro-Life has had many recent victories lately that we can find increased hope and enthusiasm in.

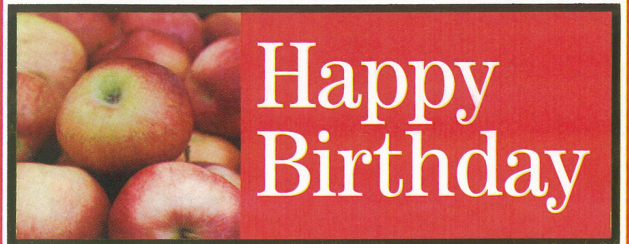
October is Pro-Life month.

Elaine and Bill met at a dance in Boston in 1963 while he was pursuing graduate studies at MIT and she was working at the Jamaica Plains Veterans Hospital. They were married on June 13, 1964 at Holy Trinity Catholic Church in Somersworth N.H., by Fr. Leo K. Ryan.

Bill was born March 26, 1936, in Evanston, IL., and is an only child. He received BS degrees in math and in aeronautical engineering from the U. of Michigan in 1958, and earned an ScD in Aeronautics and Astronautics from MIT in 1966. Elaine (Gagne) was born August 20, 1940, in Waterbury, CT, and has two younger

brothers, Bill and Dan. She earned her BS in Medical Technology from the University of New Hampshire.

Elaine and Bill lived in Somersworth and in Boston before settling in Santa Barbara in May, 1966. The oldest of their three children, Tony, was born in Boston Lying-In Hospital in August, 1965. In a moment of weakness NBC News filmed his birth for use in a Chet Huntley special. Sister Cherie arrived in July, 1967 (Santa Barbara Cottage Hospital), and the youngest, Stephanie was born at Goleta Valley Hospital in December, 1969.

Elaine worked part-time for 26 years at the Santa Barbara Medical Foundation Clinic Laboratory. She also was active in Newcomers Club, Women's Bible Fellowship, Adult Education, and as a docent at Old Mission Santa Barbara. She was in charge of the Eucharistic Ministers at St. Raphael's for over 11 years. Currently she is an officer in the Women's Service Club of Goleta, and has an online business called Dazzling Animals – Animal Themed Jewelry for Animal Lovers (dazzlinganimals.com).

Bill worked for General Electric TEMPO in downtown Santa Barbara until retirement in 1993. He has always been active in the Knights of Columbus, as GK of Council 5300 in 1990/91, Financial Secretary for a number of years, and currently as Faithful Purser (Treasurer) of Junipero Serra Assembly. He is also an active docent at Old Mission Santa Barbara, giving more

than 35 tours a year.

After Bill's retirement, he and Elaine traveled to Australia in 1993, the Czech Republic and Austria in 1995, New Zealand in 1999, Indonesia in 2000, and South Korea and China in 2003 (All of them four week trips).

Rev. Msgr. Jon F. Majarucon Now Serving As Pastor at 118 Year Old St. Raphael Parish

Rev. Msgr. Jon F. Majarucon has been appointed Pastor of St. Raphael Church on July 1st becoming only the sixth Pastor in the past 53-years in the 118-year history of the parish.

Father Jon was ordained to the Priesthood on June 16, 1984 by Cardinal Timothy Manning in the Cathedral of Saint Vibiana's skid row in Los Angeles.

One of nine children born to Felicito I. Majarucon and Amerifina 'Nina' Fuertes, R.N., Jon was number two of nine siblings: Phillip, Jon, Paula, Joseph, Jeanine, Patricia, Jamie, Jason and Felicity. He was born on Saturday, December 7, 1957.

Pope Benedict named Father Jon as Monsignor in 2010, 'the year of the Priest.' Msgr. Jon is the only Second Generation Filipino- American Monsignor in America as his parents were born in California. He was born in Mojave and baptized at Edwards AFB Chapel. Msgr. Jon recollected, "The day I visited Jerusalem then, later met and talked with Pope John Paul II in Rome in 1989 or so. I also met Cardinal Ratzinger (Pope Benedict)." These are most memorable experiences as a priest.

As a youngster Jon graduated from St. Anthony's Elementary in Oxnard in 1972 and from Santa Clara High School, Oxnard in 1976.

Asked how his initial vocation to the priesthood came about, Msgr. Jon stated, "I am not sure I can put a specific time on this. I can tell you this much. From the outset Church was a welcoming place and I was 'invited.'" My parents were DEVOUT Catholics and put all of us through Catholic School and College. My parents NEVER forced Mass, devotions or prayer on me. My exposure to Religion from the time I was small was a positive and wonderful experience...in those days we did not have a church (it was in construction) so for me "Mass" meant gathering, helping, setting up, celebrating Eucharist, taking down, then doughnuts."

Msgr. Jon continued, "My Pastor (Msgr. Michael J. Condon) was the kindest man I ever met. If you look at the records of Santa Clara Parish in Oxnard back in the 1960's there were several Emergency Baptisms performed by "Nina Majarucon R.N." I am the only Pastor that can claim my mother was baptizing babies in the Parish before I did some 40-years later as its Pastor."

While at the Seminary his ministerial training as a Collegian and Student of Theology included:

- a. Religious Education at Camarillo State Hospital;
- b. Special Education at Saint Anthony, Oxnard;
- c. Semester at Bishop Diego High School;
- d. Chaplain assistant at Daniel Freeman Hospital, Inglewood;
- e. Semester at St. Brigid's in South Central;
- f. Summer work at University of Santa Clara in Santa Clara, CA.;
- g. Deacon Summer at St. John the Baptist in Baldwin Park;
- h. Deacon Assignment at St. Margaret Mary in Lomita, CA.

"My first Mass after ordination was celebrated the very next day at Saint Anthony in Oxnard," stated Msgr. Jon.

There were 25 classmates ordained and 15 were assigned for service in Los Angeles. Msgr. noted most are now Pastors, two are Bishops (Bishop Alex Salazara and Archbishop Gustavo Siller-Garcia), four are Monsignors, five are Religious orders, two are retired and four have died.

Msgr's assignment is for six years per LA Archdiocese current policy. He doesn't have a favorite past assignment. "Every varied experience was different and had its ups and downs," pointed out Msgr. Jon. He added, "I spent 13 years as an Educator at the secondary level (high school), served in three different high schools as an instructor, Department Chair, Coach, Chaperone, Assistant Principal, Vice Principal, Curriculum Specialist, Principal and President."

Responding to what has been his most satisfying experience at his prior assignments, Msgr. Jon stated, "I did many funerals. I hope I was able to bring comfort to many of my childhood friends. I conducted many funerals in my 13 years as Pastor there (one year we had over 165 funerals). I grew up in Santa Clara Parish (before Saint Anthony was built). I buried many people who helped raise me, Moms, Dads, their daughters and sons and also my own father," who was an aeronautical engineer.

Msgr. stated he never set main goals as a priest. "I had no goals. I just wanted to celebrate Mass, hear confessions and save as many souls as I could. I just want to be a good priest for God's people," expressed Msgr. Jon.

Msgr's keys to his success as a priest, pastor were explained as such, "I live moment by moment and do the best I can for a person or a situation at that time. I don't worry about the future (I could die in my sleep) nor do I beat myself up from the past mistakes (I learn). I do my BEST for the moment."

Msgr. Jon's practical advice to the youth of the parish concerning their faith includes "Never lose contact with the Holy Eucharist, especially in the confusion of the teen years. Stop being mean to each other. Don't look for friends, BE a good friend."

Msgr. Jon sees a vision of a healthier Catholic Community in our area shaped by the Gospel message of God's love for all people.

Asked about his favorite scriptural passages in the Bible, Msgr. Jon replied, "There are 150 psalms that praise, sing, cry out in anger and frustration to God. There are also allegories, analogies, teachings, poems, adventures, tragedies, joy, sorrow, betrayal...there is a beautiful passage for every situation we find ourselves in. So no, I don't have a favorite."

"People need to sit down, dust off their Bibles and read the New Testament in its entirety. Get to know the Jesus of the New Testament. It only takes a couple of hours. Everything else is commentary," pointed out Msgr. Jon. This response was to a question on what Catholic magazines, newspapers, books, etc. he recommends that our parishioners read.

"I try to make the Old and New

Testament understandable to people. I am an upbeat person because I know and believe that God has given me the gift of eternal life. I want to share that joy," emphasized Msgr. Jon to how he would describe himself to others regarding his God-given talents as a priest, pastor, healer, leader.

Other interesting pieces of information about Msgr.'s priestly career or personal background includes:

- * My 80-year old mother, Nina, a retired nurse, always attended Mass at Santa Clara every day at 8:30 a.m. She'll miss her son, but she also thinks the move is good.
- * I had been a LAPD Police Chaplain for 15 years;
- * I am a Certified Rescue Diver (Scuba);
- * I am a Private Pilot (multi-engine and instrument IFR qualified);
- * I play a 5-string Bluegrass banjo;
- * I have been a Dean for 8-years, Pastor for 13, Educator for 13.

In all of this I celebrate countless Masses, funerals and hours of Confessional. I am very excited about life guided by God and what adventures might lay ahead. I do not like nor entertain cynics, pessimists or mean-spirited people," pointed out Msgr. Jon.

"I am a lifetime member of the Knights of Columbus, Council 750 in Oxnard. I joined when I was a teen following my father's footsteps," acclaimed Msgr. Jon.

His response to what is the best way to honor the Blessed Virgin Mary as our spiritual Mother was "Become like her son Jesus."

"I was not surprised to find other priests to be helpful when I was appointed Pastor of St. Raphael. Father Bruce Correio is a dear friend and Fr. Frank Colburn is a saintly man." He added, "By the way, my previous parish was nearly three times larger than St. Raphael's."

Some other interesting personal items:

- * Favorite class at the seminary: Maybe Patristics;
- * Hardest class at the seminary: All of them were hard for me.
- * Favorite food: I am from a large family so I eat what is put in front of me and I like it;
- * Favorite meal you prepare: Don't know how to answer this. I'm a lousy cook;
- * Favorite book: Captain Courageous (Rudyard Kipling);
- * Favorite thing to do on your day off: Fly airplanes or fish;
- * Favorite sports to watch live or on TV: NCAA Wrestling, College football;
- * Favorite sport as a participant: I was the Captain of my High School Varsity Wrestling team;
- * Hobbies: Aviation, deep sea fishing, bike riding...usually alone.
- * Growing up, I always thought I'd be: Coast Guard Officer;
- * I'm always working to improve: Becoming a better person...I wish everyone would.;
- * If I had 2 wishes they would be: That Christian and Muslim extremists undergo Conversion by a loving God, That Catholics be known, not for their liturgies, hierarchy, devotions but their incredible love for each others.;
- * In 5-years I see myself as: I never project that far ahead. I live day by day, moment by moment.

In the past 53-years these five Pastors have served at St. Raphael: Rev. Edward J. Hempling, 1961-69; Rev. Msgr. Henry A. Van Son, 1969-78; Father Thomas A. Meskill, 1978-87; Rev. Msgr. Stephen N. Downes, 1987-2002; Father Bruce Correio, 2002-14. Father Polydora J. Stockman was the first Pastor serving from June 21, 1896 to 1908.

In Its 54-Year History Since 1961 53 Grand Knights in Council 5300

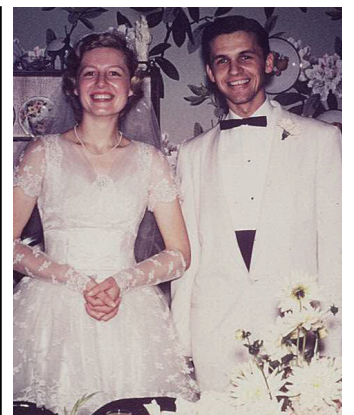
