His hobbies are enjoying playing cards, board games, 'baby sitting grandkids' and following sports and politics and learning to cook.

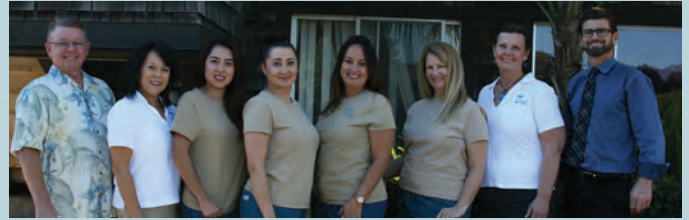
John and Mary Ellen have traveled the U.S. and parts of Canada, Mexico, Russia and Europe.

# Questions & Answers

About The Historic Mausoleum: Adjacent to the mission church, the cemetery has long been a final resting place for generations of people: Chumash Indians, Franciscan Friars and members of the founding families of early California. The Mausoleum is located in the center of the cemetery and is enclosed by 200-year-old sandstone walls. Extensive restoration and renovations were completed in 2011, and the Mausoleum now offers a new marble columbarium, which also includes pieces of sacred art. Families and friends of the deceased have found the Old Mission and this cemetery to be a peaceful environment for consolation, prayer and remembering their loved ones.

## What is a columbarium?

A columbarium is a wall-like structure composed of recesses (niches) where the cremated remains (ashes) of deceased persons are stored in containers (urns), which are sealed and marked with the names of the deceased. As in life, the dead are included as a part of the larger Mission Church community.

## Who can be buried in the columbarium at The Historic Mausoleum?

The columbarium is available to all people of faith and good will. It is not limited to Catholics, Christians, or residents of California.

## I thought the Catholic Church did not allow cremation.

The Catholic Church removed the restriction against cremation in 1963, and affirmed this position through revisions to canon law in 1983 and 1989. Cremation is now a dignified and respectful burial option chosen by an increasing number of Catholics, as well as for those who are sensitive to the lesser impact that cremation has on the environment.

## Why did the Franciscan Friars of the Province of St. Barbara build this columbarium?

Caring for the dead with respect and compassion has been an essential ministry of the Church for centuries, and here at Old Mission Santa Barbara it has been a tradition for more than two hundred years. The Franciscan spirit extends to our commitment to honor the dignity and goodness of each human person, living and dead.

## When should I make burial pre-arrangements?

The timing is yours, but many have found that by making one's own burial plans in advance, the more time one has to discuss the details and options with family and loved ones. In addition, making these pre-arrangements is usually a relief and a blessing to those who would otherwise be making these decisions at the time of a loss. Also, pre-arranging can give one peace of mind by knowing that these important details have already been considered, decided and put in writing.

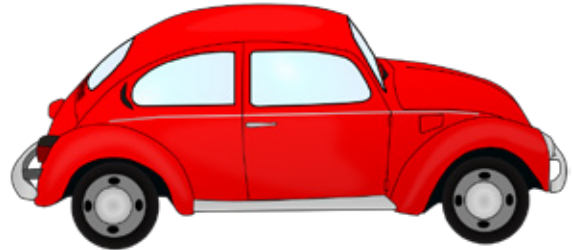
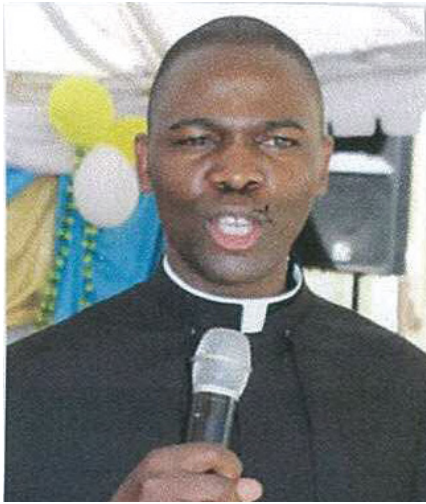

## *Vivat Jesus! Jesus Lives!*

The words Vivat Jesus! are much more than a slogan or password for the Knights of Columbus. In these words, “Jesus lives!” we find the foundation, meaning and mission of our Order.

When Pope Benedict XVI spoke for the first time in the homily at his installation Mass, he said, “The Church is alive — she is alive because Christ is alive, because he is truly risen.” It is this reality of the Risen One that animates the work of the Knights of Columbus and why we greet each other fraternally with “Vivat Jesus!”

In his first homily as supreme chaplain at the state deputies’ meeting last June in New Haven, Bishop William E. Lori spoke about the necessity of the earthen vessels of our lives manifesting the glory of the Lord. That, too, is the mission of the Knights of Columbus. As Benedict XVI reminded us at his installation, “the purpose of our lives is to reveal God to men.”

Our Order, perhaps more than any other organization of Catholic laymen, is called to witness to a world that is unbelieving, that is doubtful, that is cynical, and that in many regions has abandoned the Christian faith. This witness comes primarily through our works of charity, through our families, and through the spirit of fraternity that animates our organization; it is a witness that proclaims Jesus is truly alive and so is his Church.

The real “culture war” that we face is the insistence of secular society that Jesus is merely a 2,000-year-old historical fact that can be ignored today. Secular society’s insistence upon legalized abortion, euthanasia and same-sex “marriage” is, in reality, the symptom of this fundamental refusal to see Jesus in his full reality.

Through our works of charity, the Lord’s presence is made manifest, in so many ways, in our parishes, our neighborhoods and our families. This is why Charity remains the first and animating principle of our Order.

This is also why we continue to focus so strongly on charity and why we are so proud that our Survey of Fraternal Activity this year again shows the Knights of Columbus growing in works of charity — nearly \$136 million and more than 63 million hours in volunteer service.

With an average of \$17 for each volunteer hour, that equates to more than \$1 billion in service last year alone, and more than \$10 billion during the last decade. And in direct cash payments in the last decade we have exceeded \$1 billion.

The real importance of this is not simply a matter of dollars. The real importance is that our councils have an open door and a helping hand for so many neighbors in need.

This month we will celebrate our third Knights of Columbus Eucharistic Congress — a very special event during the Year of the Eucharist. Its theme highlights our principles of charity and unity.

As Catholics our works of charity are rooted in the divine act of charity revealed in the Eucharist, the Eucharist that is also the source of our unity. The Eucharist is our sublime assurance that Jesus lives and that he is with us!

### Latest Research: Wheelchairs Raise Employment, Reduce Begging in the Developing World

Research by a University of San Francisco graduate student shows that the work of the Knights of Columbus through The Wheelchair Foundation has a big impact on lives in developing countries. Justin Grider's work in Ethiopia demonstrates that when a disabled person is given access to a wheelchair, they spend seven fewer hours a week begging, an additional 10 hours or more on entrepreneurial activities, a 15 percent higher probability of employment, and increase their income by as much as 82 percent. "Anyone would be humbled by the struggle that those who are disabled in the developing world go through," Grider says. "If there is a cost-effective intervention that can be a catalyst for those individuals to be better included in society, have a higher probability of employment, and earn more income, it should absolutely be looked into."

Grider's research won the \$1,000 top prize at the New Economic Talent 2014 competition this summer, an international student competition in Prague that's sponsored by the Center for Economic Research and Graduate Education, one of the top graduate economic programs in the world. His findings point to the potential for large economic gains on a national scale, especially in light of 2004 World Bank research by Robert Metts that concluded Ethiopia could be losing as much as 9 to 13 percent in economic production annually by failing to address its disability needs, Grider says.

## Only having "through work" insurance doesn't work

Do you know anyone whose life or career has been drastically changed during these years of economic downturn? 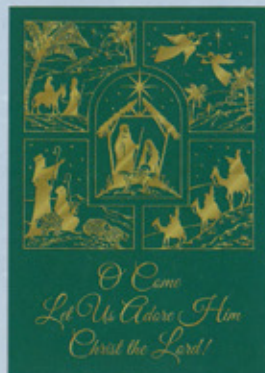
