Pro-Life Report for January 2015



Stephen Joseph "Steve" Schlesselmann passed away peacefully in Santa Barbara, CA on Friday, December 19, 2014 at the age of 59 years old. He is survived by his mother, Anne Marie Schlesselmann of

Larkspur, CA, brother and sister in law, John and Lisa Schlesselmann of Santa Barbara, CA, brother, Msgr. Gregory Schlesselmann of Fargo, ND, sisters Carolyn (James) Todd of Aurora, CO, and Barbara Purcell of Redding, CA.

He is also survived by six nephews: Michael and Patrick Schlesselmann, Liam (Ashley) and John Purcell, Ian and Shawn Todd and nieces: Sheila (Jason) Gresehover, Mary (Ryan) Finley, Elizabeth (James) Bean as well as grandnieces and grandnephews, Mia, Liam, Addy, Lucy, Davy and Kate.

He is preceded in death by his father, Herman Schlesselmann of San Rafael, CA.

Steve was born on October 3, 1955 in San Francisco, CA to Herman and Anne Marie Schlesselmann. He graduated from Marian Catholic High School in 1973 and from UC Berkeley in 1978 with a BA in Accounting. After working in a few locations in northern CA, he moved to Santa Barbara due to his love for the outdoors and the coast and mild weather.

He spent the last 15 years here where he served in multiple positions including Grand Knight and District Deputy with the Knights of Columbus Goleta Valley Council 5300. Steve also volunteered for St. Vincent De Paul Society and the Adult Literacy Program.

Steve enjoyed geology, hiking and sightseeing around the state. He was an avid sports fan, favoring the 49'ers and the Giants.

A funeral is scheduled for Tuesday, December 23, 2014 at St. Raphael Catholic Church at 10 a.m. with reception in the Parish Hall to follow. Msgr. Gregory Schlesselmann will officiate the Funeral Mass with assistance from Msgr. Jon Majarucon, Msgr. Stephen

Downes, Rev. John Love and Deacon Randy Saake. Burial service will be at 1 p.m. at Calvary Cemetery.

Eulogy Given by Stephen's Brother, John after Funeral Mass on December 23





Thank you all for coming. It is very heartwarming to have you all here to honor the life of Steve. If I could speak for Steve, he would want to express a great deal of gratitude for all those who have supported him, especially over these last 6 years. Gratitude for all those who cared for him on a daily basis, gratitude for those who drove him to different activities, gratitude for those who came to visit him and bring him Communion, gratitude to the Knights who supported him in getting to meetings, dinners and bbqs, gratitude to those in the medical community that provided for his complex and diverse medical needs, some of whom even provided their services free of charge, gratitude for those here and in the community who have prayed for Steve and continue to pray for his eternal rest with God in heaven.

Your prayers have been heard. Steve's life has been a blessing in ways we may never fully understand. He and I had a number of conversations about what God's purpose was in bringing him through the events of 6 years ago, only to have a life filled with limitations and difficulties. It became clearer with time that a part of God's purpose was to help the rest of us to extend ourselves more. When we thought we were doing enough, maybe we needed a little urging to do more. God was always showing us how to be more generous. We can never be too generous in doing for others, especially since each of those others is a child of God, as Steve certainly was. And Steve was the instrument that God chose to teach us that lesson.

On Steve's part, tenacity and perseverance has been a constant characteristic of his journey in this life. While living in Northern California, Steve sometimes wandered far in exploring the trails or a far off highway in remote Northern California. In this last chapter of his life, even though it was not his choice, he showed an example of day to day perseverance that was exemplary – perseverance in living out his circumstances each day until God called him home. It was making a difference for him as well. In many ways, he could have given up a long time ago, but he didn't. He went blind several years ago for reasons not fully understood. For over a year now, he has been experiencing a gradual increase in his visual abilities. He had a ways to go, but progress was being made. And little by little, his outlook on things was subtly changing in a positive direction. One could say he was definitely on an uptrend.

He and I also had talked about dying many times, since he was forced to confront it several times over the last 6 years. We talked about how this is the necessary step to get to the goal we live and hope and pray for, eternal life with the Lord. In this time of Christmas, we anticipate the gift of the Christ-child, the Savior who redeemed us all. We were reminded by some friends that Christmas is likely a big celebration in heaven. They must give out presents as well, because Steve just got the best Christmas present ever. Thank you for the gift of your life, Steve. Merry Christmas.







Troop 105 and Cub Pack 105 Successful 22 Day Christmas Tree Lot Seaso

Boy Scout Troop 105 and Cub Pack 105, both of which are chartered by Goleta Council 5300, are happy to report that the 2014 Christmas Tree Lot was successful. The lot was open from November 29 until December 20, and while there were many trees left over after closing preliminary calculations show that the profit generated will adequately fund the Troop budget for 2015. Leftover trees were donated to Catholic Charities and to the Teddy Bear Cancer Foundation.

Scout parents Teo Gonzalez and Bob Frey organized the tree lot, along with a lot of planning and physical help by Brother Ed Leicht and Brother Tim Hogan and active parishioners Robert Zaida and Dan Williams. Brother Rich Scholl anchored the day crew with assistance from Patrick Burgess, and Brother Glenn Schiferl installed all the lighting. Night and weekend shifts were completely filled by Boy Scouts, Cub Scouts and their parents.

The Troop provides free trees to all the classrooms at St. Raphael School, free trees for the Church altar, and free trees for the rectory and parish hall. With the profit made from tree sales, the Troop was also able to donate \$1,000 each to the Cub Pack and St. Raphael Church, and still retain enough cash to fund the Troop budget for 2015.

Several Scout parents noted that the tree lot is an important learning event for their sons, as the boys are responsible for setting up and maintaining the trees and assisting customers with their purchases. The skills practiced during the tree lot season are not generally obtainable at any other Scout function, yet are important to developing young men of responsible character.

The leaders of the Boy Scout Christmas Tree Lot acknowledged that a large number of KOC members were seen purchasing trees from the lot, and also noted the generosity of the St. Raphael parishioners in purchasing trees and wreaths. Without this kind of financial support the Troop and Pack would be forced to either reduce the quality of the programs or raise dues to the point where a large number of young men would not be able to participate in Scouting.






