Born in Los Angeles on May 18, 1924 to Edward F. and Cane Lee, Roy would be educated in Los Angeles receiving his AA Degree at LA City College.


Roy would join the U.S. Air Force at age 19. He served as aRadio Operator in Wisconsin, graduated in Control Network System and was assigned to 474th Fighter Group, 430th Squadron.

He would serve in the European Theatre to direct pilots how to return safely to their base. The pilots would call Roy for homing instructions and Roy would give them bearing instructions to come home.

Roy is survived by Elizabeth, his wife of 36 years. He is also survived by his sons Ron and Edward and daughter Eileen and grandchildren David, Stephanie, Kellie and Lauren. Roy's two brothers and two sisters passed away in the past three years.

After his military service Roy would work as Sr. Electrical Draftsman for the LA Department of Water & Power for 30+years. For 10 years Roy worked at UCSB's Facility Management as Electrical Engineer retiring in 1990.

Roy and Elizabeth (Liz) Joan Hall were married on Dec. 8, 1979 at St. Brendan Church in Los Angeles. They moved to Santa Barbara in 1981 and became very active with St. Raphael Church until 2007. They moved to Foster City and Attended St. Luke Church.



Roy would become a Knights of Columbus member on October 9, 2000, a 2nd Degree on Dec. 7, 2000 and 3rd Degree on March 6, 2005.

A man of supreme faith, intelligence, loyalty, compassion, patriotism and wisdom, Roy's passing is mourned by all who knew him. May God grant him rest and eternal joy.





Dr. Owen's Daughters' Appeal for Special Christmas Trees To Be Given to Victims of Valley Fire in Lake County



The Hurleys - Ava, 7, left, Chris and Liam, 9 - decorate a living tree they will use in their home near Forestville for Christmas and then donate to a Lake County resident whose property was devastated by the Valley fire.

In early December two women, daughters of Dr. Charles Owen, Kathy Blair and Chris Hurley, had a special holiday tree gift idea, 'Tis the season to give something that's a little unusual: your Christmas tree.'

They asked people to buy potted Christmas trees and after Christmas donate them to their grass-roots group which then distributes them among Lake County homeowners whose properties were ravaged by the major Valley fire. More than 1,200 homes were burned and 7 million trees were devastated.

Within days response was terrific and 10 nurseries in the area were participating. Douglas fir Christmas trees, native to the area were preferred as they are native to the area but Mrs. Blair stated, "We aren't picky when it comes to tree donations. They'll take anything."

She added, "When you're done with the potted Christmas tree, return it to the place you bought it and her family will pick them up and deliver them to homeowners in need."


Dr. Owen's added, "My daughters were taught at St. Raphael School and were active in the Parish Youth Group."

Christmas 2015

Dear Friends and Family,

As we gather together to celebrate Hope, Light, Peace and the Presence of God bursting into our lives, I want to wish each of you a most blessed and happy Christmas and New Year.

I think that the first thing you may notice, is a change of my address. It's likely that I will be in the states before this letter reaches you, but wanted to mail one last Christmas letter from Namibia. Because of our smaller size, Maryknoll will be leaving Namibia. The Maryknoll Sisters left in June, I will be leaving at the end of November, and Fr Albertine will leave after his 50th Jubilee in May of next vear.

After 30 years of ordained ministry and almost 20 years in Africa, I'll be returning to the states for a sabbatical in spiritual care and palliative care. I was accepted in the internship and residency program at the Mount Sinai Hospital in New York and then gratefully accepted an offer of hospitality in the rectory of St Francis de

Sales, a parish of the Archdiocese of New York. I'll be living and helping out at this great parish, and the hospital is just a couple of blocks away. It's hard to believe that at age 56, I'm returning to school, but looking very forward to the whole experience. The program is pretty intense, but hopefully, I'll be done and Board Certified by the end of 2017, and God willing, return to Africa!

With Caritas Internationalis, I continued my HIV and AIDS work and this year and we were able to provide "Train-the-Trainers" workshops for clergy and religious from several bishop's conferences in the pastoral care for people affected by AIDS and HIV. This was done in both Anglophone and Francophone countries, and we're now in the process of translating the training manual into Portuguese for the Lusophone speaking countries in Africa. Also, during much of this year, I was researching and documenting several large, faith-based programs providing care and treatment for people with HIV. The results and effectiveness were pretty amazing, and in October, the report was launched with Caritas Internationalis and UNAIDS.

I also spent a lot of time with the African Palliative Care Association, the International Children's Palliative Care Network, and the George Washington Institute on Spirituality and Health, integrating true patient-centered spiritual care into public health systems. This becomes quite the challenge when the patient's spiritual beliefs and needs are different from the provider's beliefs. But this essential aspect of care was taught in a variety of workshops both here in Namibia through the University of Namibia and the Ministry of Health, and internationally in several different settings.

This month, I also had to say "good bye" to the wonderful sisters and novices at the Benedictine Monastery just outside of Windhoek where I served as chaplain and presided at daily and Sunday mass for the community, and folks from the surrounding area.



I remain so very humbled and very, very grateful for your prayers and for the generous financial support that enables me to continue all of this work. Even though I'll be living in New York for the next couple of years, I will be able to continue my work and mission with the African Palliative Care Association, the International Children's Palliative Care Network and Caritas Internationalis. We are developing ways and means to provide holistic care not only for people living with HIV, but all individuals facing life threatening illnesses. You can continue to send any donations to: Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers, Controller's Office, PO Box 302, Maryknoll, New York 10545-0302. Checks can be made out to "Maryknoll Fathers and Brothers" and then state that the funds are for the mission account of Fr. Richard Bauer. Again, thank you for your prayers, your love and your support. May your new year be filled with many surprise blessings.
