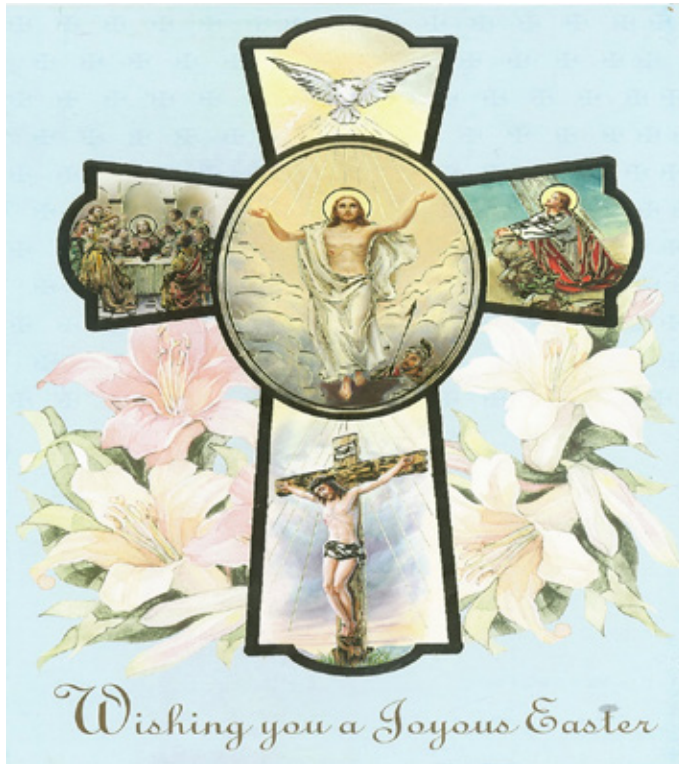

Jubilee Year of Mercy Holy Doors at St. Raphael Church

The carried man, a "lost soul" is each of us. How amazing is it to see in a visual way that we are connected as one?

The eyes on our body are not our own, we see all things through His. As Pope Francis states in his A Prayer for the Jubilee of Mercy, "Lord Jesus Christ, you have taught us to be merciful like the heavenly Father, and have told us that whoever sees you sees Him. Show us your face and we will be saved." How can we not be inspired to show mercy when we share this view of the world?

Duplicating the motif of the "mandorla" or almond shape, coming from early iconography, represents going out in the world- we each have the Holy Spirit. Yes indeed, it is inside of you, me, and each child that I teach. This sacred shape represents the joining of the divine and human. Through the Eucharist we are each blessed with this connection. We then, go out into the world and spread this love. We are this motif, we are these drops in the waters of life, making ripples, and touching those around us.

The process of creating these doors was a blessing for me. One of my precious jobs at St. Raphael School is teaching art to the whole school. While working on this project I brought all of the students to the lobby of the church to see the process, to ask questions, and to spread the Holy Spirit with them.

As I worked in the evening, the many parishioners that observed my work realized the impact of just one piece of art, the global impact of Pope Francis, and his love. There isn't a day that the students and I don't revel in "how cool" Pope Francis is. Having a Twitter [@pontifex], teaching us that loving every person on this planet, no matter who they are, is the right thing to do. Trust me, this Pope is helping us retain the youth of our Church.

How blessed we are to have this gift, this grace, this mercy! We can be inspired to forgive, to be forgiven, and to love. I pray that each time you walk through these Holy Doors at St. Raphael you are reminded of our universal language of love, and will feel the healing mercy of our Lord. As my students sit in awe of the magnitude of this gift, may you also sit in awe. Let the Holy Spirit use you as a tool to go out in the world and spread mercy.

Being asked to create these Holy Doors was a gift. At age 9 I was lucky enough to walk through the official Holy Doors at the Vatican, opened by Pope John Paul II. I asked my students which of them would have this opportunity in the upcoming year. I was given the response "in our dreams". Well the dream is standing right in front of us. Pope Francis wanted these doors, and their healing Mercy, to be available to every member of our Holy Church. To you. To me. To all students at St Raphael School.

These Holy Doors at St. Raphael unite us with every Catholic in this whole world. What a concept! This visual creation, this beautiful representation, originally designed by The Pontifical Council for Promoting the New Evangelization, can speak in not only one verbal language-- but in the universal, non-auditory form of communication --- love.

This visual allows even my youngest students to understand God's support of us. He will carry each of us on his shoulders, like my dad did to me as a child. When I was too tired to walk any further, when I needed that extra boost to see in a busy place, or even when I just wanted that fun time with my father. A powerful image of the original Jubilee logo is the sharing of the eye between the man being carried, and Jesus himself.



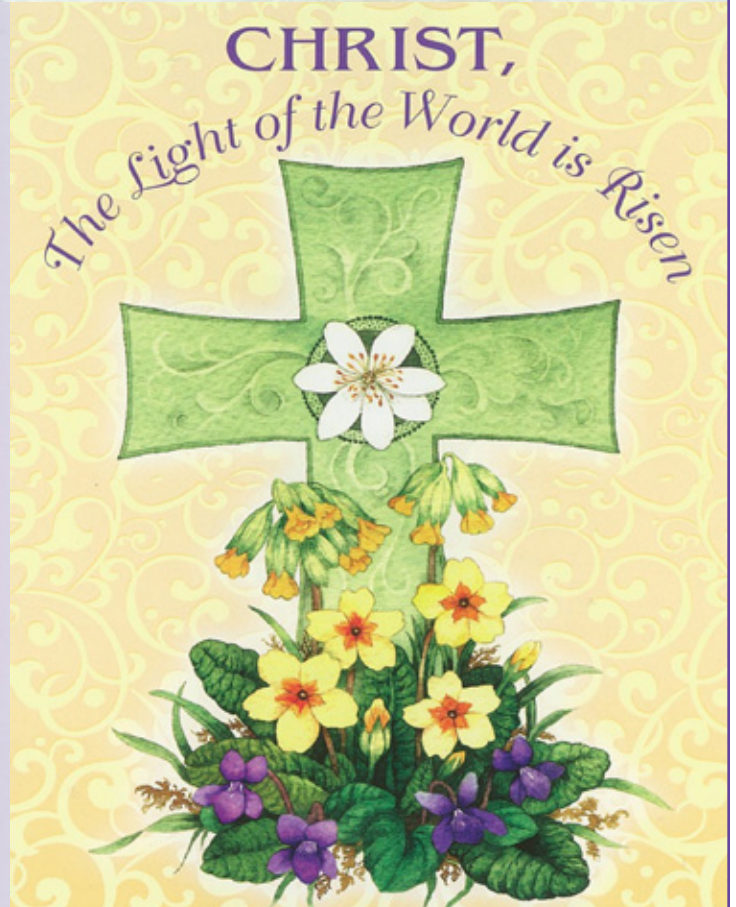
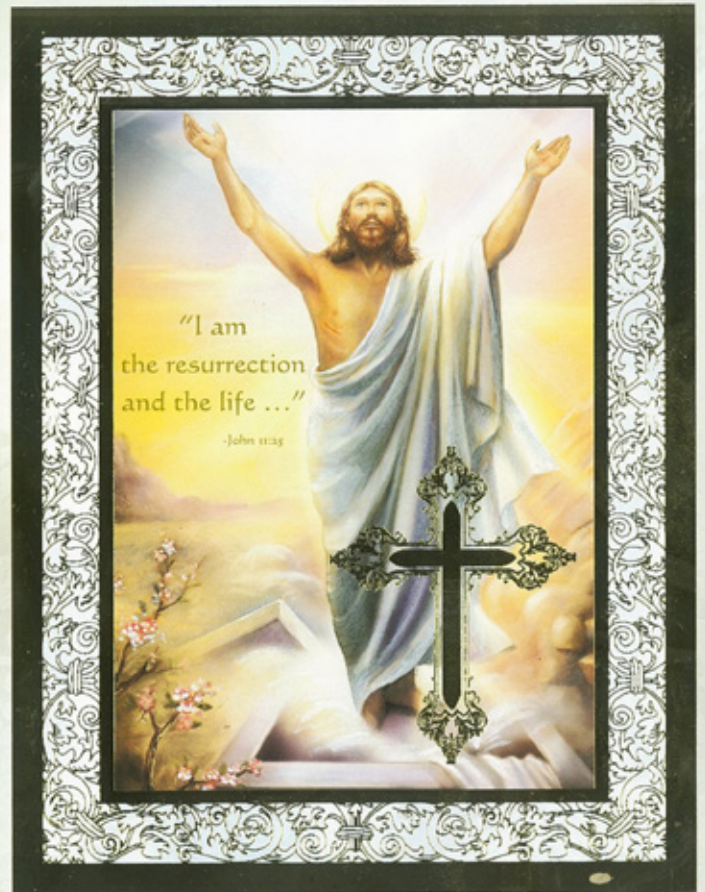
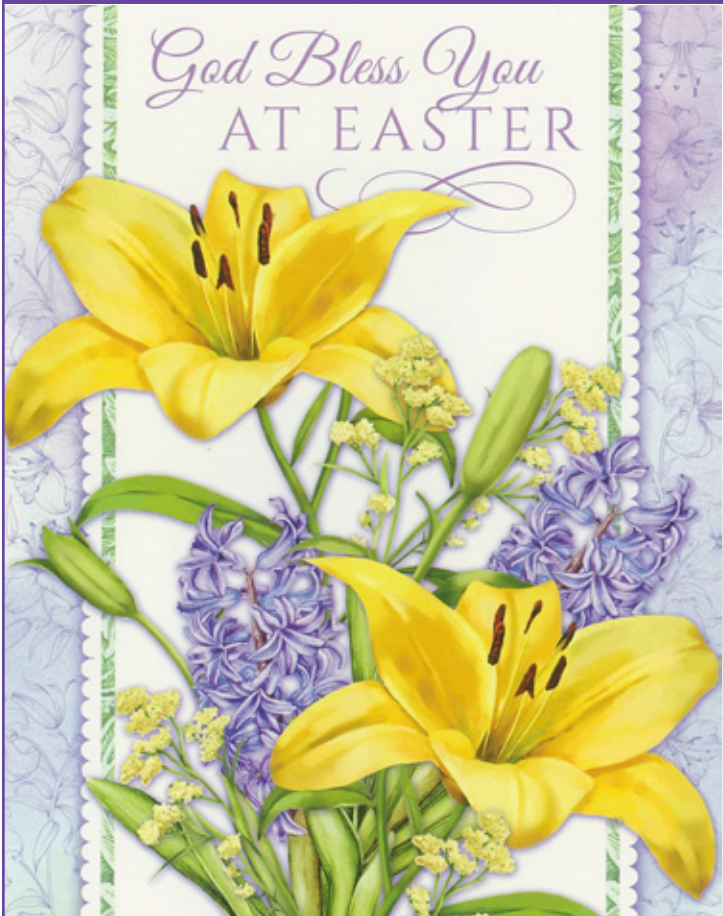

My Jesus! This Cross should be mine, not Thine! My sins Crucified Thee.

Third Station: Our Lord Falls the First Time

O Jesus! By this first fall, never let me fall into mortal sin.

Fourth Station: Jesus Meets His Mother

O Jesus! May no human tie, however dear, keep me from following the road of the Cross.

Fifth Station: Simon, the Cyrenean, Helps Jesus Carry His Cross

Simon unwillingly assisted Thee, may I with patience suffer all for Thee.

Sixth Station: Veronica Wipes the Face of Jesus

O Jesus! Thou didst imprint Thy sacred features upon Veronica's veil; stamp them also indelibly upon my heart.

Seventh Station: The Second Fall of Jesus

By Thy second fall, preserve me, dear Lord, from relapse into sin.

Eighth Station: Jesus Consols the Women of Jerusalem

My greatest consolation would be to hear Thee say: "Many sins are forgiven thee, because thou hast loved much."

Ninth Station: Third Fall of Jesus

O Jesus! When I am weary upon life's long journey, be Thou my strength and my perseverance.

Tenth Station: Jesus Is Stripped of His Garments

My soul has been robbed of its robe of innocence, clothe me, dear Jesus, with the garb of penance and contrition.

Eleventh Station: Jesus Is Nailed to the Cross

Thou didst forgive Thy enemies; my God, teach me to forgive injuries and forget them.

Twelfth Station: Jesus Dies on the Cross

Thou art dying, my Jesus, but Thy Sacred Heart still throbs with love for Thy sinful children.

In Loving Memory of **John James Sternot**

October 2, 1912 --- February 22, 2016



John James Sternot of Goleta, California died on Monday, February 22, 2016 at the age of 103.

He was born on October 2, 1912 to Jacob and Josephine (Shymanski) Sternot in Town of Sigel, Wisconsin on the family farm located on Sternot Road. John celebrated his birthday on Oct. 2 although the government in 1990 told him it was Oct. 12.

He attended Spring Lake School and Lincoln High School where he was on the basketball team. As a youngster John would walk to the grade school but would take a train to attend high school, 10-miles away. This daily event had him walking 2 ½ miles to catch the train. A few times John actually walked 10-miles home when the train was inoperable.

On August 25th, 1936 he married the love of his life, Mildred Swarick. They recently celebrated their 79th wedding anniversary. They were married at Sts. Peter and Paul Catholic Church in Wisconsin Rapids, WI. by Rev. Stephen Anderl.

John worked at Eight Corners Cheese Factory where he was a licensed cheese maker, hauled milk for White House Milk Company in Vesper, Wisconsin, farmed in the Town of Siegel area and owned two taverns: Johnny's Bar and the Caravan in Wisconsin Rapids. John became a truck driver for Arco Auto Carriers and CTI and drove for 30 years without an accident. He retired to Goleta in 1973.

John was a member of the Knights of Columbus, Council 5300, since December 1976. Soon afterwards he became a 2nd and 3rd Degree (April 17, 1977). His favorite KC activities included the annual Oktoberfest Dinner-Dance and the Labor Day Picnics. For years he made the wood doll cradles and reindeer for the Parish Christmas Boutiques.

Members of the St. Raphael Parish since 1972, John and Mildred attributed their long fruitful life of 79-years of marriage to "working together, taking part in activities like walking, dancing and eating healthy. The key to their successful marriage include 'togetherness.'" – 'where one went so did the other.'

At St. Raphael's, John served faithfully as an Usher at the 9:30 Sunday Mass for 28-years, retiring in 2005. Msgr. Stephen Noel Downes stands out for being special to John and Mildred. After John's heart surgery, Msgr. Downes brought him Holy Communion every Sunday promptly between 2:30 and 3 p.m. In their 43-years as members of St. Raphael's John and Mildred's most memorable events were the Centennial Celebrations held in 1996 and being a part of the 324-page Yearbook. They also will be in the upcoming 120th Parish Anniversary Directory.

John's hobbies included walking, reading, gardening, fill-in puzzle books and checking out National Geographic and Traveler, Birds and Blooms magazines.

John and Mildred loved traveling, having been to 49 states except Alaska. They made the trip to Wisconsin many times.

John is survived by his wife Mildred and daughter Delores of Goleta. The Sternots are proud of Delores, born May 29, 1939, for scheduling doctor appointments, getting them to them, reading and answering their mail.

He was preceded in death by his parents Jacob and Josephine, brothers Joseph, Anton, Francis, sisters Mary Mras and Anna Hahn, nephew Edmund Sternot who the family raised as a son.

John loved saying the rosary, which he did 3 or 4 times a day. In his honor, the rosary will be recited at 9:30 a.m. followed by the Funeral Mass tentatively scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Monday or Tuesday, March 7th or 8th at St. Raphael's Church with Msgr. Stephen Downes, Celebrant.

Burial will be later in Wisconsin Rapids where a Memorial Mass will be held at St. Lawrence church preceded by the rosary. Burial in Calvary Cemetery.

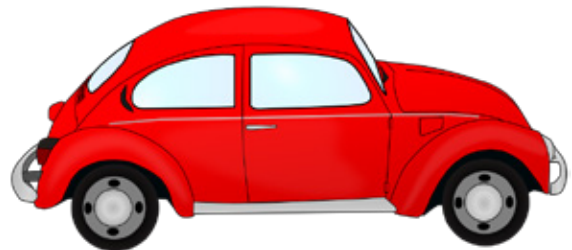
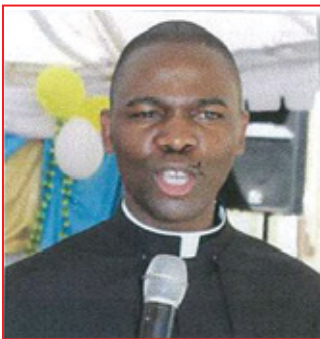
